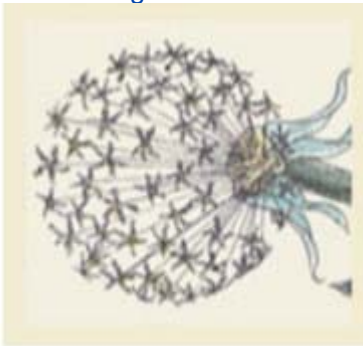

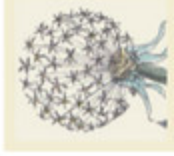


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BAROLO

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While shopping for holiday wines, we came across a brand, which we had admired in the past, but didn't feel we had the clientele as yet who would share our enthusiasm.

That time has past and [Vietti Vineyards](#) has arrived. These Piedmont region vineyards are not only delightful in that they offer both single vineyard and cru-designed wines, but in that they are known as the artist label wines. The artwork, some of which has been displayed in MOMA, is inspired by the wine of the particular vintage and each work is used only once, just for the wine of that vintage.

While many Barolos are not only pricey but purchased solely for future enjoyment, Vietti 2007 Barolo is absolutely drinkable with a price point of around \$53. We also recommend the 2009 Barbera D'Alba (approx. \$27) and the 2008 Nebbiolo (\$28).
